The film may be based on a clunky premise — how Asian youth are responding to global competiveness - but it's moving and enchanting to see, especially toward the end: Dozens of art students float down the misty Mekong River, painting the landscape as they go; at the sight of the "wisdom tree" sacred to the Buddha, half hit the water and swim toward it.
