Two days before the doors open at Frieze London, our friends at <u>Lehmann Maupin Gallery</u> took us behind the scenes for the installation of one of the most exciting booths at the fair. While the allure of a polished booth is nothing short of magic, we couldn't resist the chance to get a look at the nittygritty of mounting a museum-quality exhibition—in miniature, in two days.

Flanked by a Shirazeh Houshiary painting and a Tracey Emin embroidery, Do Ho Suli's Secret Garden gets the finishing touches.
