Emma Son Appointed Senior Director of Lehmann Maupin Seoul

New York, February 11, 2019—Rachel Lehmann and David Maupin are pleased to announce Emma Son is now Senior Director of Lehmann Maupin. Son, based in Seoul, has headed the gallery's second Asian outpost since its opening in 2017, and works closely with Lehmann Maupin artists Lee Bul, Kim Guiline, and Suh Se Ok. Her new title ranks her among the gallery's highest leadership, and recognizes her role in overseeing and directing the strategy of Lehmann Maupin's expansion into Korea and greater Asian markets.

Son joined Lehmann Maupin after more than 20 years as both a curator and gallerist in Seoul, bringing with her an established collector base, nuanced understanding of 20th-century and contemporary artists, and longstanding connections with the region's most important institutions. Under Son's direction, Lehmann Maupin has rapidly expanded the scope of its program in Seoul, moving from by-appointment viewings to a full public exhibition program that was inaugurated by Nari Ward in 2018, the artist's first exhibition in Korea. Presently the gallery is showing Gilbert & George, also the artists' first Korean exhibition. Prior to joining Lehmann Maupin, Son worked

for many years for the well-respected Kukje Gallery, before founding her own Gallery EM in 2007.

"We knew Emma Son would be an instrumental force in leading the gallery in Seoul, and have been impressed with all she has accomplished for the gallery overall in just a short time," said David Maupin. "Her new title of Senior Director recognizes her accomplishments and reiterates our commitment to growing the gallery in Korea, where we have long held ties through our artists Lee Bul, Do Ho Suh, Kim Guiline, and Suh Se Ok. Our experience operating Lehmann Maupin Hong Kong since 2013 has made clear that a major key to the success of the gallery in Seoul would be having strong, local leadership, experienced and adept in the region."

Son states: "I've long admired what Lehmann Maupin has accomplished in Asia and beyond, and was humbled and honored to join the gallery and offer my perspective on the incredible potential in Seoul. The city offers unprecedented opportunity as it assumes a greater position within the global

art market, with world-class private collections and museums now driving much of the demand in the region. I am personally committed to building increased global awareness of Korean artists, as well as the potential cross-cultural significance of bringing international artists to Korea."

Rachel Lehmann and David Maupin founded Lehmann Maupin in 1996. The gallery represents a diverse range of American artists, as well as artists and estates from across Europe, Asia, Africa, South America, and the Middle East. It has been instrumental in introducing numerous artists from around the world in their first New York exhibitions. Known for championing artists who create groundbreaking and challenging forms of visual expression, the gallery prioritizes personal investigations and individual narratives. Lehmann Maupin prizes the distinct conceptual approaches that its artists offer on the essential matters that shape international culture today, including gender, class, religion, history, politics, and globalism. In 2013, with two locations in New York, significant interest in its artists abroad, and growing opportunities in new markets, Lehmann Maupin opened an additional location in Hong Kong, followed by Seoul in 2017.
